But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.

Peace: Dictionary Definition

- 1. freedom from disturbance; tranquillity.
- 2. a state or period in which there is no war or a war has ended.

Peace: Church Definition

3. a passive resignation to the painful realities of life

Peace: Biblical Definition

4. shalom בוֹן לְש - completeness, soundness, welfare, peace

Jeremiah 29:7

But seek the welfare (shalom) of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare (shalom) you will find your welfare (shalom).

Psalm 1:3

He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season,

and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers.

Peace: Amplified Definition

- 1. not just freedom from disturbance; but full of joyful noise.
- 2. not just lack of conflict; but relationships full of deep connection
- 3. not just lack of anxiety; but full of hope for the future

"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"

Luke 1:76-79 - Agents of Peace

And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways, to give knowledge of salvation to his people in the forgiveness of their sins, because of the tender mercy of our God, whereby the sunrise shall visit us from on high to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:6-7

Agent of Peace

Because I am at peace, now I can work for peace (Shalom) without anxiety
